



## Windows Live Mail

1. Click  >E-mail or you may type wlmall in the Start Search bar.
2. If this is the first time opening this program skip to Setup 3. If it is not the first time then you need to click on Add e-mail account link on the left hand side of the program.



3. Fill in the necessary information and check the box that says “Manually configure server settings for e-mail account” and click next.

server will need to be 995 and the port for the outgoing server will need to be 465.

7. Check the box at the bottom that says “My outgoing server requires authentication” and click next.
